

THE KINZUA BRIDGE TOUR: September 13, 14, 15, 16 (Fri, Sat, Sun, Mon)



Two 150-mile days will bring us directly northwest as we slice across the Endless Mountains of Central Pennsylvania. We'll stop for the first night at an interesting B&B. Previous years included 'The Bison Farm' and 'The Blue House On The Hill', each fascinating in its own way. Day two is only slightly longer, but much more remote, ending up in tiny Coudersport, a town ripped from the 70's, after a short stop at



amazing Hyner View. Sunday morning, we wake up early and ride 35 miles to this incredible sight.....

300 feet tall and over 2,000 feet long, it was built in 1882 and collapsed in a tornado in 2003. You can walk out to the viewing platform on the end, and the view includes the wreckage and the fall foliage. It is spectacular! Then breakfast in scenic Emporium to set up a 225 mile day.

But wait, there's more.... in addition to 4 days of riding on super vintage bikes, through some of the most beautiful countryside anywhere (the west bank of the Susquehanna River is stupendous at this time of the year, and the roads are to die for) we return via Hershey, PA, making a stop at the Antique Auto Club Museum. The Husqvarna motorcycle exhibit is an easy add on before the last day's 75-mile run home. You cannot pack anything more into 4 days.
